





Katrin Sergejew, the fashion designer

The talented fashion designer from Apolda, Katrin Sergejew, creates asymmetric and sustainable fashion that is recognised worldwide. She is passionate about customising fabrics using screen printing. Her training as a fashion designer in Schneeberg, Saxony, and her subsequent studies in Finland made Katrin Sergejew a professional. In 2007, at the age of 24, she founded her own label "kaseee" in Apolda. Since then, she has presented her collections every year on numerous catwalks in cities such as Paris, Zurich, Riga and Berlin.

Apolda offers Katrin enough space to produce her fashion. She appreciates working with local knitting companies that can quickly realise her designs. The town's expertise offers creative potential and supports her artistic vision.

Michael Dane, the green connoisseur

British landscape architect Michael Dane was the pioneer of the “Open Gardens” in Thuringia, which were imported from his native England. For 18 years now, nature lovers have had the opportunity once a year to enter private gardens that might otherwise be closed, to be inspired and, with a bit of luck, to meet Michael.

Michael Dane spent a long time travelling through faraway countries before he finally found his home on a farm in Nermsdorf in the Ilm Valley in the Weimarer Land. Since then, his creative influence has not only extended to the spa gardens and clinic in Bad Berka, but has also manifested itself in the squares, parks, fountains and gardens throughout Thuringia, including Jena, Gotha, Bad Sulza and Weimar. In many corners of these idyllic places, he leaves his unmistakable signature, which reveals a simple but profound truth: “Good gardeners are like artists – and the plants are their colours.”

Andreas Schwarz, who hardens the steel

Andreas Schwarz, a man with a heart for the art of blacksmithing, fulfils his passion for the craft in the small village of Hetschburg on the Ilm. After training as a blacksmith, he travelled the world, including to Israel. Here he found a mentor who remains a good friend to this day. Since 1990, this small pump house has shone as a blacksmith's studio, a place of creativity and freedom. Here, Andreas transforms red-hot iron into art, passing on his love of the craft not only to his son Benedikt but also to blacksmithing enthusiasts from all over the world. During the weekends, the forge becomes a meeting place for the generations. This is where Andreas and Benedikt meet with curious eyes and nimble hands. They work and create together in workshops, demonstrate forging sessions and forge new contacts.

The works of art that are created in this creative environment are like stories that preserve bygone times and yet come across as modern and surprising. An oversized ant at the entrance welcomes visitors and invites them to immerse themselves in the world of blacksmithing.

Alexander Weimann, “customised suits” made from the finest sheet metal

With the desire to become a musician, Alexander Weimann began his apprenticeship as a metal wind instrument maker in the renowned Leipzig workshop Syhre. After completing his master’s degree in 1984, he studied to become a restorer of old historical wind instruments. After his years of travelling in Switzerland and his return to Thuringia, his dream of building his own instruments came true.

Turning a piece of sheet metal into a customised instrument requires the union of musician and instrument. Each piece is unique and customised to the musician. The trademark by which Weimann instruments can be recognised is the red screw that binds the water key to the metal.

This high standard makes the hearts of national and international clients beat faster. His instruments can be found not only in Thuringian orchestras but also in ensembles such as the opera houses in Hamburg and Frankfurt, the Munich Philharmonic Orchestra, the Nuremberg Symphony Orchestra and global orchestras such as the Paris Opera, the Chicago and Toronto Symphony Orchestras and the Bangkok Symphony Orchestra. Even musicians from the opera “La Fenice” in Venice appreciate this quality.





Their deep connection and intellectual exchanges inspired Goethe to write some of his most important works of poetry and influence the perception of the landscapes to this day.



Lyonel Charles Adrian Feininger | 1871–1956 | Painter and graphic artist

Feininger shaped the Bauhaus movement in Germany and also left a significant artistic legacy in New York City. Inspired by the picturesque villages, light-flooded forests, and dynamic architecture of the Weimarer Land, his world-famous motifs have been arised. His influence transcends geographical borders and generations, leaving a lasting legacy for artists worldwide.

Through his work, he significantly shaped the cityscape of Weimar and is considered the inspirer of the strolling culture of the Kneipp spa town. Regenerative heat and power generation, water conservation using low-flow shower heads and aerators and recyclable materials in to-go sales to reduce waste all benefit the environment.

THE HOHENFELDEN RESERVOIR AS AN ENERGY STORAGE FACILITY

EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE ON THE HOHENFELDEN RESERVOIR

The progressive warming of the water jeopardises the fish population and the entire biodynamics of all lakes. In addition, increased evaporation is causing water loss. A lighthouse project has been developed to strengthen the climate resilience of the Hohenfelden reservoir: Lake thermal energy (Seethermie) involving the Avenida thermal baths.

But what is lake thermal energy? Lake thermal energy can be explained by the principle of a large heat exchanger – heat is extracted from the lake. This process alone already has a positive effect on the lake, but it is also used to generate heat for the Avenida thermal baths within a closed cycle, i.e. no water is extracted, but it flows back into the lake in a continuously cooler state. The list of benefits for the environment is long: sustainable heat supply, savings on fossil fuels, preservation of biodynamics, reduction in temperatures and compensation for evaporation, less algae formation...

The Avenida-Therme company, along with TEAG Solar, Bauhaus University Weimar, and Jena GEOS Ingenieurbüro GmbH are indispensable partners for the Hohenfelden reservoir adventure region. The project is crucial for preserving the lake's quality, water, and animal habitat.




The Bauhaus Museum Weimar showcases the world's oldest Bauhaus collection. As a place of open encounter and discussion, it recalls the early phase of the most significant design and art school of the 20th century, linking its history with questions about shaping life in the future.

The Bauhaus Museum welcomes visitors with minimalist chic and a self-confident aura. Its clear lines and spacious forecourt provide the space to think beyond what is presented here. The exhibition presents the most important Bauhaus collection in the country – a legacy founded by Walter Gropius himself. The Klassik Stiftung Weimar now houses 13,000 objects and documents, including the famous Wagenfeld lamp, Marcel Breuer's slatted chair and Marianne Brandt's teapot. From Paul Klee to László Moholy-Nagy, the exhibition reveals important design history from the 18th to the 20th century.




THE CITY OF SCIENCES JENA *meets...*
